Some of them were happy to say that being inspired of the gift being adoptive parents they felt in Orphan Care Camp they adopted more children. Another could share about great changes in their children's behavior since the last seminar at the camp.

Seminars consisted of many practical tasks to be used by parents in the future in order to build



close relations with their kids. The peculiarity of the conference is that David shared his own experience of how he and his wife found the way out of conflict situations while nurturing their daughters. It should be mentioned, that both David and Colleen underwent special training course in the Texas Christian University dedicated to bringing up difficult children. Based on his knowledge, David focused on useful practices of physical and psychological development of orphan children, what in turn

gave a deeper insight into understanding their misbehavior. To make the acquirement of new information easier for parents, the lecturer divided all the participants into groups for them to discuss the most troublesome issues.

This conference was very inspiring for parents who have a difficult child in a family. In the end of the meeting every parents were given the floor to share his/her impressions of the lecture. All words are weak to describe their emotions!
