We give thanks that once again last winter we have been able to gather our annual olive harvest. We want to recognize the work done by our brothers from Holland who come each year to lend a hand. Their faithful and consistent help has become the "annual olive appointment," creating a very comforting and affectionate relationship for which we are very grateful.



**Change of monitors:** we want to express our thanks for the time that Javier Jiralde served with us as a monitor. Now he leads an anti-drug association called

"Breath of Life" in Puente Genil that occupies much of his time, although he continues to be connected to us, sending people to the center. We welcome Antonio Benítez who has joined our team; he once had problems with addiction, but now he enjoys a full life with a wife and children, and is dedicated to the work of serving others, testifying to the power of Christ in his life.



## New facilities built at the rehabilitation center

We thank God that we have been able to build a building to store firewood and miscellaneous equipment; since firewood is our only means of heating the center in the winter, we were needing a place to store it.



Water tanks: due to the drought in general and some water problems we had last year, we started a project to acquire five water tanks with a capacity of 22,000 liters (± 5,800 gallons) each, to increase our reserve capacity of potable water. We want to thank the entities that have already financed part of the project: the Church of Hollywood of GB, which has financed one tank, the Añora Municipal Government (which paid for the site work and



most of one more tank. We still need to finance 3½ tanks, which have a unit price of 1,700 euros. Let's all pray that new supporters join in to help with this project.

They spent a day at the rehabilitation center with the residents, with everyone learning from each other what God was doing in the peoples' lives. It was a very good time and full of stories and experiences lived out by faith in Christ Jesus. Encounter with Felipe: this week, as I was walking down the street, getting ready for some family time and rest, a voice stopped me—"Francis, do you recognize me?" Surprised and a little confused, I tried to make out who it was, but Nathalie said, "I know that voice, you are Felipe!" Felipe is a man from Pozoblanco who was rehabilitated in 1992. It was a difficult case, but now he lives in Madrid, has a job and his own house, and lives a normal life. Accompanied by his wife, he was pushing a wheelchair, from which his mother, with an old but peaceful face looked at me with tranquil eyes and asked me to give her a kiss. I remembered how many times this mother, weeping, had asked me for help, desperate and tired of her struggle. The years have passed, and the image is totally different: now the son who had caused so many problems in the past was taking her out for a stroll; the years had slowly but surely softened the once-harsh memories of the trouble produced by drug addiction. Felipe greeted our whole family, we said goodbye, and went on our way. This event reminds us that all the work done up till today is worth it! There is hope and transforming power when we live and breathe the Gospel of Christ.

## Two psychologists arrive from Guatemala: the Abrego family

Rene and Gloria Abrego, from The Way Bible Center of Guatemala, will soon be joining our team, to work with the Good Samaritan Association and with the church. Both are professional psychologists; Rene specializes in addictions, and Gloria in child and family psychology. They will be an excellent reinforcement for the various activities we carry out. Please pray for them, that the issues of their legal status and finances be resolved.
