a. Getting Alpha off the Ground



Our first Alpha course got under way last Tuesday evening (Jan 31), and we are encouraged by the degree of interest shown. The launch attracted nine visitors, most of whom came back for the first evening of the course. Some comments really encourage us.

"At the age of 38, I feel a bit ashamed to admit that I have not yet come to a conclusion about the purpose of life."

This particularly honest comment came from one gentleman who had previously been to our apartment on a few occasions with his family. Another friend, whom we hadn't seen for ages, came announcing "Anna, we're going to be neighbours!" We are looking forward to having Marta and Nuno living nearby, and that God will work in their lives also.

Another young mother, who had been part of our "Lusitos" activity, is attending the course, having come back into our lives after a gap of almost two years.

Now what we have to do is to get people from Alpha to Omega, so to speak, and this is **our real prayer challenge** - for people to stay the course for the full 10 weeks, and for meaningful conversations to develop.

In the run up to the first evening, we, on the team, all experienced severe spiritual attacks - heaviness, marital arguments, and a sudden and inexplicable violent sickness affected one person just 30 minutes before the evening session began.

As we're moving in this area of, as Paul says, "rescuing people from the dominion of darkness to the Kingdom of God's son" (Col 1:13), we shouldn't be surprised by all of this but we do value your regular prayers for us

b. Getting our Church on the Ground

Besides the Alpha Course, the Park of the Nations Church plant is moving into the next phase of its life, as an established church ... with its own leadership structure and establishing formal membership. We hope to pass on some of the everyday responsibilities we have carried (How exciting, Anna says, no more washing cups and plates every Sunday evening!")
